F I E L D P E R I O D I N T E R N S H I P P R O G R A M

The Keuka College Field Period internship program provides students the opportunity to link academic learning with hands-on experiences. The College dedicates approximately one month of the academic calendar for students to concentrate solely on their Field Period internship. **These internships are a minimum of 140-hour experiences done each year by all students.** Through Field Period internships, students can explore and develop career possibilities, test academic principles, investigate diverse environments or cultures, raise awareness of social responsibility, and enhance their cultural understanding of the world. Field Period requirements may be completed anywhere, from the local community to foreign countries. The faculty supports and works closely with students in planning, preparing, and evaluating Field Period internships.

Keuka College Application Information

Application deadline

Keuka College accepts applications for admission on a rolling basis. Students may submit applications anytime throughout the year. However, most scholarship deadlines require that you be accepted to the College no later than Jan. 31. Applications submitted after the Jan. 31 deadline will be reviewed and awarded if funding is available. Admission Notification

Applications for admission are reviewed upon receipt of all required application materials beginning December 1. Applicants typically receive notification of the College's decision within 2-3 weeks after that time.

REQUIRED Materials to be Considered for Admission

1. Completed Application for Undergraduate Admission.
2. Application fee of \$50 (please make all checks payable to Keuka College or submit credit card payment).
3. Official high school transcript with GPA.
4. Admissions Essay (at least one required): essay as outlined below or creative writing submission/published composition.
5. At least one letter of recommendation provided by a school official (teacher, guidance counselor, principal, etc.).

1. A completed Application for Undergraduate Admission.
2. An application fee of \$50 (please make all checks payable to Keuka College or submit credit card payment).

3. First Generation Scholarship applicants: if you are the first generation in your family to go to college, you should submit your First Generation (see page 7) Scholarship essay as your admissions essay for consideration for this scholarship.

- Candidates must attend a special interview/competition day.

Leading the Way First Generation Scholarship:

Valued at \$24,000 to \$50,000 (**guaranteed*** over four years of undergraduate study).

- Must be a high school senior whose parents did not attend any college.
- Must demonstrate strong academic promise, leadership potential, and have an overwhelming desire to make the world around them better.

- Must be available to serve a fellowship directed at encouraging high school students to “lead the way.”
- Submission of an essay, one-to-two pages in length (can be used as admissions essay), answering the following question: *What would the Leading the Way First Generation Scholarship mean to you, and how do you motivate others to lead the way?*

George H. Ball Achievement Award:

Valued at \$24,000 - \$50,000 (**guaranteed*** over four years of undergraduate study).

- Must be a high school senior.
- Should have a solid academic record.
